**Vocabulary**

<b>bronze</b>	A metal alloy made from a mixture of copper and tin. It is a much harder and more long-lasting material than stone or copper alone.
<b>alloy</b>	A metal made by combining two or more metals to improve its properties.
<b>bone marrow</b>	The substance inside bones, which is high in fat and a good energy source.
<b>earthwork</b>	A large bank or mound of soil that has been made on purpose.
<b>Celt</b>	A modern term for the people living in Europe during the Iron Age. The ‘Celts’ were made up of many different tribes. The word ‘Celt’ comes from a Greek word.
<b>sacrifice</b>	To give something up, break it or kill it as an offering to a god or gods.
<b>tribe</b>	A group of people, often related through family, culture and language, usually with one leader.
<b>iron</b>	A metal that is stronger and harder than bronze.
